

## BYLAW NO. 1/80

### A BYLAW RESPECTING THE DISCHARGE OF BOWS, CROSS-BOWS, FIREARMS AND SLING SHOTS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF WHITEWOOD

The Council of the Town of Whitewood, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. Bylaw No. 1- 1948 is hereby repealed.
2. For the purpose of this Bylaw;
  - “firearm” means any barreled weapon from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged and that is capable of causing serious bodily harm or death to a person, and includes any frame or receiver of such a barreled weapon and anything that can be adopted for use as a firearm.
  - “cross-bow” – means any strong bow mounted crosswise on a stick.
  - “bow” – means a weapon for the shooting of arrows.
  - “sling-shot” means a weapon used manually for shooting small stone or shot.
3. No person shall discharge and no person shall allow any person to discharge any bow, cross-bow, firearm or sling-shot within the limits of the Town of Whitewood, without the express permission of the Mayor, his delegate or the Chief of Police.
4. Any person convicted of violating the Provisions of Section 3 of this Bylaw shall be liable upon Summary Conviction to a fine not exceeding One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or in default of payment to a term of imprisonment for a period of no less than 7 nor more than 30 days and in addition the bow, cross-bow, firearm or slingshot shall be confiscated and forfeited to the Town.
5. Introduced and read three times and adopted by resolution of Council on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1980.
