

BYLAW 18-2005

A BYLAW TO REGULATE ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES

The Council of The Town of Whitewood in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. In this bylaw, including this section:
 - (a) “all terrain vehicle” and/or “ATV” means all terrain vehicle as defined in *The All Terrain Vehicle Act*;
 - (b) “highway” means a highway as defined in *The Highway Traffic Act* and includes a road, parkway, driveway, square or place designed and intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles, but does not include any area, whether privately or publicly owned, that is primarily intended to be used for the parking of vehicles and the necessary passageways on that area;
 - (c) “private land” means land other than public land as defined in *The All Terrain Vehicles Act*;
 - (d) “public land” means Crown land or any land vested in the municipality, as defined in *The All Terrain Vehicles Act*;
 - (e) “traveled portion” means part of a highway designed for vehicle travel including the shoulder of the road;
 - (f) “untraveller portion” means part of a highway not designed for vehicle travel including the ditch and the centre median;
 - (g) “vehicle” means a vehicle as defined in *The Highway Traffic Act*.
2. It shall be lawful to operate an all terrain vehicle during the hours between sunrise and one half hour after sunset on the public highways within the limits of the Town of Whitewood, with the exception of, that portion of Lalonde Street between South Railway and 4th Avenue.
3. Notwithstanding (2) it shall be lawful to operate an all terrain vehicle on that portion of Lalonde Street between South Railway and 4th Avenue for the purpose of crossing the said street.
4. Persons operating an all terrain vehicle on the public highways within the limits of the Town of Whitewood must be using the all terrain vehicle for the sole purpose of transportation to and from their home, by the direct shortest

distance between their home and private land.

5. No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle on the public highways within the limits of the Town of Whitewood without a valid driver's license.
6. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$50.00.
7. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon approval thereof by the Highway Traffic Board.
