Bill 64 Proclaimed

Last week Bill 64, the *Act to Amend The Power Corporation Act and The SaskEnergy Act*, was proclaimed into law. You can see the committee discussion, in which more information was offered on some of the historic contracts affected by the act, in the video archive of the [Standing Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs and Justice from Tuesday, May 9, 2017.](#)

Of note, legislators voted to drop from the bill wording that would have denied local governments the ability to defend legal agreements, or be compensated for this loss of revenue. In committee, Government Relations Minister Donna Harpauer affirmed that power bill surcharges collected from ratepayers in [109 urban municipalities](#) will be redirected from those municipalities to the provincial general revenues to help cover the budget deficit.

On May 12, we issued [this response to Bill 64](#) calling for meaningful consultation. We remain in close contact with the 109 hometowns affected, as they assess their legal options.

Government of Canada Introduces Legislation to Legalize Cannabis

Last month, the federal government introduced Bill C-45 (the Cannabis Act) which would create a national framework for the production, distribution, sale, and possession of cannabis across Canada. If approved by parliament, the bill could become law by July 2018.

In response to last summer's consultation on cannabis legalization, SUMA emphasized the need to protect the safety and health of residents, and ensure resources were provided to municipalities. This is particularly important as municipalities are responsible for bylaw enforcement, building standards, zoning issues, and emergency response.

We continue to engage the federal and provincial governments on these issues in partnership with municipal organizations across Canada, including FCM and SARM, and ask that you share with us your views on the legislation. If you have comments or updates to share, please contact Steven Dribnenki.

The City of Regina is partnering with SaskPower to use waste gas from their landfill to generate electricity. The facility was unveiled in March, with a 20-year agreement to generate roughly \$1 million in revenues for the city each year.

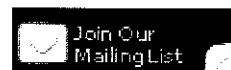
